Messages Assurance of Salvation (1) Four Types of People on Revival

Assurance of salvation means that a person is without doubt about his being saved, being forgiven, having obtained eternal life and becoming a child of God. This is a matter concerning life and death eternal, and thus never regard it lightly or carelessly.

Concerning salvation, there are mainly four types of people:

1. Not saved, and they themselves know that they are not yet saved

These people do not know what salvation really means or they doubt about the gospel. They need to heed and understand the gospel fully and to receive the Lord Jesus as their personal Saviour, or else their ending will be tragic!

2. Not saved, yet they themselves think that they are already saved

These are "nominal" Christians:

They do not fully understand the gospel or what is meant by believing in His name for forgiveness. They have wrong ideas about the faith. For example, they may regard themselves as Christians because their parents are Christians, or because they have been attending church meetings, or because they have been "baptized".

They do understand the full gospel, knowing that the Lord died for their sins on the cross and was resurrected. Yet they are unwilling to abandon their selfish and sinful life and to receive the Lord Jesus as their personal Saviour. They want to indulge in the pleasures of sin and are unwilling to yield themselves to the Lord.

3. Saved, but they are always doubting

These people never dare to say definitely that they are saved. They lack the assurance of salvation. Sometimes even true Christians who have believed in the Lord for years are accused and disturbed by the devil so that they often wonder whether they are saved or not. Their confidence of dwelling with the Lord in the glorious heaven is shaken. They lose the steadfast hope and joy; they lack faith and strength in their ministry; they doubt whether God is their Heavenly Father. They may come to such a stage that they try to be saved by good works and be justified by observing the law.

4. Saved, and they themselves have the absolute confidence that they are saved

This refers to every Christian who knows that his sins are forgiven and is enjoying the eternal life. His faith is never shaken because he has clearly accepted the Lord Jesus as his personal Saviour and is determined to follow Him. Because of the Lord and His blood, he has absolute confidence that he will live eternally with God in the glory and he does not have the slightest doubt on being received to heaven.

Our Heavenly Father wants us all to be the fourth type of people, full of faith, hope, joy and boldness to lean on His bosom. He wants us to rejoice and run happily the life journey that leads to heaven!



A true Christian with full assurance of salvation should have both the knowledge of the gospel and the decisive act of receiving Jesus Christ as his Lord and Saviour.

(I) You must know the Gospel:

The Lord Jesus is the Son of God. The Lord Jesus is God.

The Lord Jesus descended from heaven to the earth and was nailed on the cross for our sins. He suffered the punishment in our stead and was forsaken by the Heavenly Father. The Lord Jesus has risen from the dead. He is a living Saviour who can help and deliver people from all sins.

(II) You must take the decisive act: receive Jesus Christ as your personal Saviour and Lord

- To ask for the forgiveness of sins, solely relying on the Lord Jesus who bled and died for you to bear your sins.
- ▶ To receive the Lord Jesus as your personal Saviour and be saved from the sinful life by His help.

If you fully understand and believe that the Son of God, Jesus Christ, has died to take your place at the punishment; if you have sincerely confessed your sins to God, asking for His forgiveness; and if you have received the Lord Jesus as your personal Saviour, then you should believe with full conviction that:

All your sins have been forgiven by God.

"If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." (1 John 1:9, NKJV).

You have become a child of God.

"But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name:" (John 1:12, NKJV).

You have eternal life.

"For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life." (John 3:16, NKJV).





You should no longer doubt about your salvation because God is faithful. He will do according to His promises in the Bible. You only have to receive once for all the Lord Jesus as your personal Saviour. You do not need repeated conversions, asking for His forgiveness and accepting Him as your personal Saviour again and again. Instead, you should thank Him for having forgiven you and cleansed you from all your unrighteousness. The Lord Jesus is your Saviour forever and God is your Father till eternity – this relationship never changes!

Meaning of the "Church" by Dadson Lai

The first person mentioning the word "Church" in the Bible is Jesus Christ. In Matthew 16:18, He said to Peter, "And I also say to you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build My church, and the gates of Hades shall not prevail against it."

How did Jesus describe the church? The Greek word He used for "church" is "ekklesia" (Strong's Concordance* #1577), which means "a group of people called together for a purpose" or "an assembly".

"Ekklesia" comes from "ek" (Strong's Concordance #1537) and "kaleo" (Strong's Concordance #2564), meaning "out from and to" and "to call" respectively. In the New Testament, "ekklesia" (church) implies that a group of people who have been called out of the world and to God and gather together. Thus, the church does not refer to a building, but an assembly of believers in Jesus.

Apostle Paul said, "Likewise greet the church that is in their house." (Rom. 16:5). He is greeting brothers and sisters in Rome, not a church building.

Jesus announced, "I will build MY church..." The church belongs to Jesus, and church is His desire. He would establish His own church which always prevails. He will be responsible for the church to the end.
